**Subject: St. Petersburg, Florida 2013 primary election for Mayor and referendum survey, conducted for SaintPetersBlog.com**

**Date: August 19, 2013**

**Executive Summary:**

This poll of 1051 early or likely City of St. Petersburg voters was conducted on Monday, August 19, 2013. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of August 3rd, 2013 and the absentee ballot return list as of August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2013. The sample of voters that were called included random samples of registered voters within the city of St. Petersburg, Florida.

The issues surveyed included the 2013 race for Mayor and the Lens Pier referendum question appearing on the primary election ballot.

**Methodology:**

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the registered voter population in St. Petersburg. The demographics used were: party, race and age.

The voters polled were chosen at random within the registered voter population inside of the City of St. Petersburg. Only voters that answered that they were planning on voting in the August 27<sup>th</sup> Primary election, or had confirmed that they had returned their mail ballots, were asked the questions included in this survey.

Early voters and likely voters were polled separately in this survey, and the subtotals for each sample are shown after the combined results in the summary.

An Early voter is someone who has returned their mail-in ballot as confirmed by the Pinellas County Supervisor of Elections as of August 19, 2013. A Likely voter is someone who has not returned a ballot, but has confirmed that they do intend to vote in the primary election.

The questions were only slightly different for Early voters as compared to Likely voters. For instance, Early voters were asked what they “did” vote for, while Likely voters were asked what they “will” vote for. Also, Early voters had a “did not vote” option instead of the “undecided” option given to Likely voters.

The demographics of the early voters differ greatly from the demographics of the general registered voter population, as you can see by the chart below. For example, the mail-in ballot participation rate so far is much higher for people over 50 years old. Voters over 50 make up 48% of the registered voter population, but over 80% of the total number of voters that have turned in their mail-in ballots. You should take these demographic differences into account when you look at the survey results.
