Executive Summary:

This poll of 584 City of Tampa, Florida registered voters was conducted on Thursday, August 15, 2013. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of July 3rd, 2013. The sample of voters that were called included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the city of Tampa, Florida.

The issues surveyed included hypothetical contests for Mayor and several city issues.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the registered voter population within the City of Tampa, Florida. The demographics used were: party, race and age.

The voters polled were chosen at random within the registered voter population within the City of Tampa, Florida.

The scientific results shown in the summary below have a sample size of 584 respondents and a Margin of Error of 4.1% at a 95% confidence level.
