

Subject: Florida State House District 30 Election survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: September 11, 2014

Executive Summary:

This poll of Florida 346 active voters was conducted on Thursday, September 11, 2014. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of August 4, 2014. The sample of voters that were called included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida State House District 30.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2014 election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter populations for Florida State House District 30. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within Florida State House District 30. Only those voters that said they were planning to vote were included in the results. Only those voters that voted in the 2010 or 2012 general elections were included in the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 346 and a 5.3% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.

Summary of Scientific Results:
