Subject: Florida State House District 47 Republican Primary Election survey conducted for Florida Politics.com

Date: July 15, 2014

#### **Executive Summary:**

This poll of 311 Florida registered Republican voters was conducted on Tuesday, July 15, 2014. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of June 6, 2014. The sample of voters that were called included random samples of registered Republican voters within the boundaries of Florida State House District 47.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2014 election.

### **Methodology:**

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the registered Republican voter population for Florida State House District 47. The demographics used were: race, age and gender.

The voters polled were chosen at random within the registered Republican voter population within Florida State House District 47. Only those voters that said they were planning to vote were included in the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have their sample size of 311 and a 5.6% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.

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#### **Summary of Scientific Results:**
