**Subject: Florida State House District 65 Election survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com**

**Date: July 14, 2014**

**Executive Summary:**

This poll of 498 Florida registered voters was conducted on Monday, July 14, 2014. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of June 6, 2014. The sample of voters that were called included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida State House District 65.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2014 election.

**Methodology:**

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the registered voter population for Florida State House District 65. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The voters polled were chosen at random within the registered voter population within Florida State House District 65. Only those voters that said they were planning to vote were included in the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have their sample size of 498 and a 4.4% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
