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Subject: Florida State House District 65 Election survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: October 14, 2014

Executive Summary:

This poll of Florida 655 active voters was conducted on Monday, October 14, 2014. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of September 4, 2014. The sample of voters that were called included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida State House District 65.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2014 election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Florida State House District 65. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within Florida State House District 65. Only those voters that said they were planning to vote were included in the results. Only those voters that voted in the 2010 and 2012 general elections were included in the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 655 and a 3.8% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
