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Subject: Florida State House District 96 Primary Election survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: August 20, 2014

Executive Summary:

This poll of Florida registered Democratic voters was conducted on Tuesday, August 20, 2014. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of August 4, 2014. The sample of voters that were called included random samples of registered Democratic voters within the boundaries of Florida State House District 96.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2014 election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the registered Democratic voter population for Florida State House District 96. The demographics used were: race, age and gender.

The voters polled were chosen at random within the registered Democratic voter population within Florida State House District 96. Only those voters that said they were planning to vote or had already voted in the August 26th primary were included in the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have their sample size of 150 and a 8.0% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
