Subject: Florida State Senate District 22 Election survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: July 14, 2014

Executive Summary:

This poll of Florida registered and active voters was conducted on Monday, July 14, 2014. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of June 6, 2014. The sample of voters that were called included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida State Senate District 22.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2014 election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the registered and active voter populations for Florida State Senate District 22. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The two separate samples of voters polled were chosen at random within the registered voter population within Florida State Senate District 22. Only those voters that said they were planning to vote were included in both sets of results. Only those voters that voted in the 2010 and 2012 general elections were included in the active voters section.

The scientific results shown for the ALL VOTERS questions below have a sample size of 574 and a 4.1% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.

The scientific results shown for the ACTIVE VOTERS questions below have a sample size of 607 and a 4.0% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
