Florida Statewide General Election survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: November 2, 2014

Executive Summary:

This poll of 1,834 Florida likely voters was conducted on Sunday, November 2, 2014. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of September 4, 2014. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the state of Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2014 Florida general election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the likely voter population for the state of Florida. The weighting demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The voters polled were chosen at random within the registered voter population within the state of Florida. The random sample used was made up of a proportional sampling of registered voters from every one of Florida's 120 State House districts. Only those voters that said they were planning to vote in the general election were included in the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 1,834 and a 2.3% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
