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Subject: Jacksonville, Florida General Election survey analysis

Date: May 18, 2015

Executive Summary:

This analysis of 1,282 Jacksonville, Florida likely voters' election survey responses was conducted from Tuesday, May 5, 2015 through Friday, May 14, 2015. This analysis used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of April 6, 2015. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of The City of Jacksonville, Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2015 city election.

Methodology:

The analysis was conducted by randomly selecting proportionally representational results from automated phone call polling and web-based email polling conducted during the survey period. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Jacksonville, Florida and the demographics of the voters that had submitted their ballots as of Sunday, May 17, 2015. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within Jacksonville, Florida. Only those voters that said they were planning to vote or had already voted in the May 19 election were included in the results. The EARLY VOTERS responses only included voters that were confirmed to have voted by absentee or early voter ballots using Duval County early voter data through Sunday, May 17, 2015. The ALL VOTERS sample includes all of the responses that are in the EARLY VOTERS sample.

The scientific results shown for the ALL VOTERS responses below have a sample size of 1,282 and a 2.7% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level. The party balance is DEM +3%.

The scientific results shown for the EARLY VOTERS responses below have a sample size of 604 and a 4.0% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level. The party balance is DEM +5%.
