**Subject: Pinellas County Congressional Election Survey conducted for Florida Politics.com** 

Date: September 18, 2016

#### **Executive Summary:**

This poll of 739 Florida likely voters was conducted on September 18th, 2016. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of July 12, 2016. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida's 13<sup>th</sup> Congressional District.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2016 general election.

#### Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Florida's 13<sup>th</sup> Congressional District. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within Florida's 13<sup>th</sup> Congressional District.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 739 and a 3.6% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
