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**Subject: Florida State Senate District 18 Election Survey
conducted for FloridaPolitics.com**

Date: October 25, 2016

Executive Summary:

This poll of 950 Florida likely voters was conducted on October 25th, 2016. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of October 20, 2016. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida's 18th State Senate District.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2016 general election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Florida's 18th State Senate District. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within Florida's 18th State Senate District.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 950 and a 3.2% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
