Executive Summary:

This poll of 620 registered Florida voters was conducted on June 28th, 2016. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of June 7, 2016. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the City of St. Petersburg, Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the City of St. Petersburg, Florida.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the registered voter population for the City of St. Petersburg, Florida. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within the City of St. Petersburg, Florida.

The scientific results shown below have a sample size of 620 and a 3.9% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
