Subject: Pinellas County Congressional District 13 Election Survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: January 30, 2017

Executive Summary:

This poll of 1,289 Florida Congressional district 13 registered voters was conducted on January 30th, 2017. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of December 6th, 2016. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida's 13th Congressional district.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2018 general election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Florida's 13th Congressional district. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within Florida's 13th Congressional district.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 1,289 and a 2.7% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
