

Subject: Florida U.S. Congressional District 15 Republican Primary Election Survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: May 27, 2018

Executive Summary:

This poll of 494 likely Florida Republican Primary voters was conducted from May 25th to May 27th, 2018. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of May 9th, 2018. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered Republican party voters within the boundaries of the 15th Florida Congressional district.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2018 primary election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active Republican primary voter population for the 15th Florida Congressional district. The demographics used were: race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered Republican voter population within the 15th Florida Congressional district. Voters that stated they were not planning on voting in the primary election were excluded from the results below.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 494 and a 4.4% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
