conducted for FloridaPolitics.com**

Executive Summary:

This poll of 988 likely General Election voters was conducted from September 15th to September 16th, 2018. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of July 10th. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the 18th Florida State Senate district.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2018 general election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for the 18th Florida State Senate district. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within the 18th Florida State Senate district. Voters that stated they were not planning on voting in the general election were excluded from the results below.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 988 and a 3.1% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.

Summary of Scientific Results:
