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Subject: City of Orlando Survey conducted for StPetePolls.org

Date: July 22, 2019

Executive Summary:

This poll of 325 Orlando, Florida registered voters was conducted from July 20th to July 22nd, 2019. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of July 9th, 2019. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters from Orlando, Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the City of Orlando 2019 election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Orlando, Florida. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population of Orlando, Florida.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 325 and a 5.6% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
