Date: October 20, 2019

Executive Summary:

This poll of 717 St Petersburg, Florida likely voters was conducted from October 19th to October 20th, 2019. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of July 9th, 2019. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the City of St Petersburg, Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the City of St Petersburg 2019 general election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for the City of St Petersburg. The demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered voter population within the City of St Petersburg. Respondents that stated they were not planning on voting in the election were excluded from the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 717 and a 3.7% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
