Executive Summary:

This poll of 1,015 likely Florida Congressional District 21 voters was conducted on October 2nd, 2020. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of August 4th, 2020. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida's 21st Congressional District.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the November election in Florida's 21st Congressional District.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted through an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Florida's 21st Congressional District. The weighting demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

Only voters who had stated that they were likely to vote in the November 2020 election were included in the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 1,015 and a 3.1% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.

Florida's 21st Congressional District Voters' Demographics

Here are the demographics for all registered voters, the active voters and the difference between the two. For this poll, we weighted based upon the demographics of the active voters. An "active" voter is considered active if they have voted in an election in the last 4 years. All percentages are rounded.
