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**Subject: Florida State Senate District 39 survey conducted for
FloridaPolitics.com**

Date: August 2, 2020

Executive Summary:

This poll of 203 likely Democratic Florida State Senate District 39 voters was conducted from August 1st to August 2nd, 2020. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of June 9th, 2020. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida's 39th State Senate District.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the Democratic primary election in Florida's 39th State Senate District.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted through an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active Democratic primary voter population for Florida's 39th State Senate District. The weighting demographics used were: race, age and gender.

Only voters who had stated that they were likely to vote in the August 2020 primary election were included in the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 203 and a 6.9% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
