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**Subject: Florida Statewide survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com**

**Date: January 28, 2020**

**Executive Summary:**

This poll of 2,590 likely Florida Democratic Presidential Primary voters was conducted from January 27, 2020 to January 28, 2020. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of January 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the state of Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the Florida Democratic Presidential Preference Primary.

**Methodology:**

The poll was conducted through an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active Democratic voter population for the state of Florida. The weighting demographics used were: race, age, gender and media market.

Respondents that stated they were not likely to vote in the March 17<sup>th</sup> Primary election were excluded from the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 2,590 and a 1.9% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
