Date: February 11, 2020

Executive Summary:

This poll of 2,293 registered Florida voters was conducted from February 10 to February 11, 2020. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of January 7th 2020. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the state of Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to several statewide issues in Florida.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted through an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for the state of Florida. The weighting demographics used were: political party, race, age, gender and media market.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 2,293 and a 2.0% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
