Executive Summary:

This poll of 2,758 likely Florida voters was conducted from October 29 to October 30, 2020. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of October 13th 2020. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the state of Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2020 General Election in Florida.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted through an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the anticipated voter turnout for the state of Florida. The weighting demographics used were: political party, race, age, gender and media market. Anticipated turnout was calculated by using the demographics for the 2016 and 2018 general elections, also taking into account the voter demographic changes that have happened in the last two years. This model ended up favoring Republicans by about 1% more than our statewide polls for the last several months before last week's poll. We also used Education level quotas for the sample of respondents.

Respondents who stated they were not likely to vote in the election were excluded from the results.

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 2,758 and a 1.9% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
