Subject: Florida U.S. Congressional District 6 Special Election survey conducted for Florida Politics.com

Date: March 25, 2025

Executive Summary:

This poll of 403 likely Florida U.S. Congressional District 6 special election voters was conducted from March 22, 2025 to March 25, 2025. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of January 14, 2025. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Florida's U.S. Congressional District 6.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the April 2025 special election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted through a combination of an automated phone call polling system and a manual P2P SMS polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Florida's U.S. Congressional District 6. The weighting demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

Voters that stated they were not planning to vote in the April special election were excluded from the results below.

The share of respondents by contact method: Phone call = 84% SMS texting = 16%

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 403 and a 4.9% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
