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Subject: Palm Beach County, Florida survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: March 31, 2026

Executive Summary:

This poll of 453 Palm Beach County, Florida registered voters was conducted on March 30-31, 2026. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of March 10, 2026. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of Palm Beach County, Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2026 general election for Palm Beach County, Florida.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted through a combination of an automated phone call polling system and a manual P2P SMS polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for Palm Beach County, Florida. The weighting demographics used were: political party, race, age and gender.

The share of respondents by contact method: Phone call = 60% SMS texting = 40%

The scientific results shown for the questions below have a sample size of 453 and a 4.6% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
