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Subject: Florida Statewide survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: September 17, 2026

Executive Summary:

This poll of 913 likely Florida voters was conducted from September 15-17, 2026. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of August 11, 2026. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered voters within the boundaries of the state of Florida.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the 2026 Florida General election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted through a combination of an automated phone call polling system and a manual P2P SMS polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active voter population for the state of Florida. The weighting demographics used were: political party, race, age, gender and media market.

Voters that stated they were not planning to vote in the 2026 general election were excluded from the results below.

The share of respondents by contact method: Phone call = 57% SMS texting = 43%

The scientific results shown for the general election questions below have a sample size of 913 and a 3.2% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
